It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to the Spring Dance Concert. We are thrilled that you have gathered with us to witness live dance and celebrate student and faculty creativity!

A value in our department is providing opportunities for students to work with a variety of choreographers across dance genres and approaches to making dances, and this concert features the work of guest artists Trebien Pollard and Martha Connerton. Pollard, Assistant Professor of Dance at Virginia Commonwealth University, joined us for a choreographic residency in January to create the new work, *Quiet Resistance*. Over an intensive rehearsal period, Pollard challenged students with new ways of moving and creating that they continued to hone over the semester as they rehearsed the piece. Connerton, a Charlotte community member and the director of Martha Connerton/Kinetic Works, worked with her cast to develop not only the movement material for her piece *Bookish*, but also a sound score that features recordings of the students' voices. In addition to guest choreographers, we are delighted to welcome back guest Lighting Designer Jennifer O'Kelly, whose lighting beautifully complements and distinguishes the individuality of each work.

The concert reflects a semester-long focus on students' dance and performance attributes, as well as their abilities to collaborate and work across different aspects of production, from lighting design and stage management to backstage preparation. It also includes the work of Department of Dance faculty choreographers, Audrey Baran and Ashley L. Tate.

Faculty Biographies

Audrey Baran (Visiting Assistant Professor, she/her) is a Filipina-American Charlotte-based dance maker, performer, and educator. She holds a MFA in Dance from Hollins University and a BA in Dance and Graduate Certificate in Anti-Racism in Urban Education from UNC Charlotte. Baran was a selected choreographer for the 2022 Joffrey Ballet's Winning Works and Charlotte Ballet's Innovative: Direct from the LAB 2021. She has presented work in the Richmond Dance Festival, FEMMEfest, NDEO Conference, Bill Evans Somatic Dance Conference, NC Dance Festival, Tobacco Road Dance Productions, Triangle Dance Project, Ladyfest CLT, and Charlotte Dance Festival. Baran is the founder / artistic director of multifaceted contemporary dance company and nonprofit organization, Baran Dance. <u>www.baran.dance</u>

Ashley L. Tate (Assistant Professor, she/her) is a director, choreographer, educator, and performer from Saint Louis, Missouri and the founder and artistic director of Ashleyliane Dance Company. Tate received her MFA in Dance from Washington University in St. Louis. In addition to various cities in the state of Missouri, her work has been featured in showcases in New York City, Baltimore, Las Vegas, Chicago, Boulder, and Santa Monica. She is the co-producer of *Dance the Vote*, a non-partisan grassroots arts-based voter registration initiative and a key participant in the nationally recognized *No Tears Project*, a multidisciplinary festival designed to honor Civil Rights history. Her current research focus is centered around the use of dance as a vehicle for community advocacy and a tool for social change.

Guest Artist Biographies

Martha Connerton is a teacher and choreographer with an outstanding range of experience. Martha danced with companies including Pacific Northwest Ballet, Louisville Ballet, Joyce Trisler Danscompany and American Ballet Comedy and spent 10 years as an independent dancer, choreographer and teacher in New York City. She has choreographed works for numerous ballet and modern dance companies, opera and musical theater including American Ballet Theatre II, Louisville Ballet, North Carolina Dance Theatre, New York Theatre Ballet and Charlotte Ballet 2.

In 2000 she formed Martha Connerton/Kinetic Works, which produces dance projects, the most current being the NC Choreographers Residency Project, begun in 2022, which supports independent dance creators with studio, production funds and presentation of their work.

Martha has served on the Visiting Artist faculty at UNC Charlotte, Winthrop University; UNC Greensboro, Hamilton College and Winona State University. She was Director of the Academy and Education for North Carolina Dance Theatre and a teaching artist for Lincoln Center Institute in New York, Blumenthal Education Institute in Charlotte and Arts Education Rosters for North and South Carolina. <u>www.mckineticworks.org</u>

Trebien Pollard is a graduate of Florida A&M University with a BS in Mathematics Education and NYU Tisch School of the Arts with an MFA in Dance. He received training at the Alvin Ailey American Dance Center, Florida A & M University, Florida State University, Martha Graham School of Contemporary Dance, and from a number of gifted teachers and choreographers. Trebien has performed with many dance companies, including RIOULT, the MET (Metropolitan Opera Ballet), Ronald K. Brown/ Evidence, Bebe Miller Company, Urban Bush Women and Pilobolus. Currently. Trebien is an Assistant Professor at Virginia Commonwealth University, as well as a licensed certified GYROTONIC® /GYROKINESIS® trainer.
