Note: AAHP students must maintain a 3.5 GPA throughout their undergraduate studies to remain in good standing. Failure to do so means being removed from the AAHP and all associated benefits, including Priority Registration. If a student falls below that mark, then she or he will have a semester to recover. Ultimate decisions about a student's standing in the AAHP are made by the AAHP Director. GPAs are checked once a semester.

Courses (17 credit hours of coursework):

□ AAHP 2600: Introductory AAHP Honors Seminar Semester Taken:

This is a 2-credit introductory seminar taught by Dr. Emerling in the Spring semester only. It is required of all AAHP students. Students are encouraged and should ideally enroll in this seminar in the Spring semester of their first year in the program. Exceptions regarding which semester a student enrolls in the seminar are made for transfer students and for other extenuating circumstances at the discretion of the Director of the AAHP.

□ LBST H or HONR course (3 credits)

To fulfill this coursework the course may be listed as either an LBST H or an HONR course. HONR signifies courses offered through the University Honors Program, which is a specific honors program but our program accepts these courses for our coursework. If the course is an LBST, our students must enroll in the honors section of it. Note the LBST \underline{H} designation.

□ AAHP Topics Seminar (3 credits)

Semester Taken:

Two AAHP seminars are offered every semester. The responsibility of offering these seminars is shared by the units in the college so each semester a different unit offers one. These seminars are prepared by the units in consultation with the AAHP Director. Prior to registration the Director will send the advisors and the students in the AAHP a course title, description, and meeting time for each AAHP seminar being offered in a given semester.

Ideally, one of these AAHP seminars should be from a unit outside of the student's home department/school.

□ AAHP 3900 Honors Thesis (3 credits)

Semester Taken:

This is an independent study course an AAHP students enrolls in with his or her Thesis Advisor. A student selects a Thesis Advisor during the Application to Candidacy process. (See below.) Enrolling in this course is done only during a student's final semester and is required for completing the honors thesis and our program. All AAHP coursework must be completed before enrolling in AAHP 3900.

AAHP 3900 is offered to an AAHP student after he or she successfully completes the Application to Candidacy process. The Application to Candidacy process is required for all students at UNC Charlotte completing an honors thesis. So the semester before she or he would be enrolling in AAHP 3900. The process begins with a consultation with the AAHP Director. The process, which includes writing and researching a thesis proposal as well as forming a thesis committee of three faculty members, must be signed off on and submitted to the Honors College by Reading Day of the semester.

Students do not receive any AAHP course credit for the Application to Candidacy work they undertake during the semester before enrolling in AAHP 3900.

Note: Substitutions or exemptions from this coursework are frequently made, especially to facilitate an AAHP student's desire to study abroad. Any questions regarding substitutions or possible exemptions should be addressed to the AAHP Director.
